Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year C



Fr. Mark writes: In his First Letter to the Corinthians St Paul continues to develop the reason for our Christian hope, which we reflected upon last week. Basically, he says, our hope rests upon one thing: the Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Our faith is an idea or philosophy, a piece of cultural baggage, or a social welfare programme. It is a relationship with a Person, and that Person died and was raised to new life, a life He wishes to share with us.

Christianity stands or falls upon that one claim: the Resurrection. If Christ was not raised, Paul says our faith is in vain. 'But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep.' Jesus is risen – a historical, physical fact attested by hundreds of witnesses, the willingness of the apostles and martyrs to give their very lives for this claim, the fact that countless disciples have lived their lives on this basis. The Resurrection is our hope for the future, but also our joy for the present as we look forward to our destiny and share the life of the Risen Christ even now.
