Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time - Year C



Fr. Mark writes: Following his conversion, St Paul travelled, preached, and wrote ceaselessly. Only two things mattered to him. The first is the core message of the Gospel, which he shares today with the early Christians in Corinth – as he does with everyone he encounters: : 'Christ died for our sins ... He was buried ... He was raised on the third day'. We too should never lose hold of this fundamental message, always sharing it with others. The second thing which

concerns Paul passionately is the effect the Gospel has had on him. He has gone from being a persecutor to God's chosen instrument: 'it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me'.

Baptism Preparation Sessions

Children should be baptised in the first weeks of their lives. If you have not attended baptism preparation for an older child, you should do so now, and we can arrange a date for the baptism after the second session.

Jubilee Year

Every 25 years the Church celebrates a Jubilee Year, marking the anniversary of the Incarnation of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Its roots are in the Old Testament – an understanding that periodically we must reset our relationship with God and seek to correct injustices. It is a moment of joy. The theme of this particular jubilee has been designated as that of hope – a commodity often in short supply today – realising that Christian hope is based always in Our Lord Jesus Christ, His Resurrection and offer of eternal life.

Pilgrimage is a theme of jubilee years. It is a good opportunity to visit Rome. The Diocese has organised a pilgrimage route. 'the Westminster Way', from the Tower of London to the Cathedral for those who wish to walk the path of the saints who lived and gave their lives in London. I will be accompanying some of the children from the Good Shepherd School on pilgrimage to the Cathedral next month. In jubilee years we celebrate especially the mercy of God and indulgences are offered from His overflowing treasury of mercy. To gain the indulgence, we must go to Confession to be purified of our sins, receive Holy Communion reverently, and pray for the intentions of the Holy Father.
